This past year, we launched the new Give Smart SC app to make wise giving easier. It is my hope that members of the public will use this free app before making a charitable donation. Remember to always give from the heart, but please give smart!

CHECK

Use the Give Smart SC app or the <u>Charities Search</u> feature on the Secretary of State's website at <u>sos.sc.gov</u> to check whether a charity is registered to solicit donations in South Carolina. You can look up a charity's financial information, including total revenue, total expenses, fundraising costs, and the percentage spent on charitable programs, as well as review a copy of the charity's most recently filed annual financial report.

ASK

If you are solicited for a donation, always ask:

- What is the name, location, and mission of the charity?
- How much of your donation will be used for program services?
- If you are being solicited by a professional fundraiser, how much of your donation will go to the charity, and how much will be used to pay for fundraising costs?




If you have concerns about a charity or professional fundraiser, notify the Secretary of State's Office through the <u>Online Charitable Solicitation Complaint Form</u> at <u>sos.sc.gov</u>. You can use this form to file a confidential complaint 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can also contact the Division of Public Charities at charities@sos.sc.gov or 1-888-CHARITI (242-7484).


Through the administration of the Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act, the Secretary of State registers organizations soliciting charitable donations in South Carolina and issues violations for failure to comply with the Act. Here are some highlights from the 2022-23 fiscal year:











In order to promote accountability and transparency in charitable fundraising, Secretary of State Mark Hammond is publishing the 2022-2023 Wise Giving & Professional Solicitor Report of the Division of Public Charities. Pursuant to the South Carolina Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act, the Secretary of State's Division of Public Charities regulates charitable solicitations in this state. Some charitable organizations use professional or paid fundraisers to solicit donations on their behalf.

In addition to providing information on how donors can research charitable organizations soliciting in South Carolina, the Wise Giving & Professional Solicitor Report offers a comprehensive listing of financial data from joint financial reports and fundraising contracts filed with the Division of Public Charities in 2022 and 2023. Prior to starting a fundraising campaign, professional solicitors are required to file a notice of solicitation and fundraising contract with the Division of Public Charities. At the conclusion of a fundraising campaign, or each year of a multi-year campaign, a professional solicitor is required to file a joint financial report with the Division of Public Charities. The joint financial report must be signed by both the professional solicitor and the charitable organization, and must disclose the gross receipts from the campaign, the itemized expenses incurred by the professional solicitor, and the total amount remitted to the charitable organization. This report includes data provided in joint financial reports filed by professional solicitors during 2022, and a listing of all active and/or filed fundraising contracts between the dates of October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023.

Part I of the Professional Solicitor Report lists each charitable organization for which a joint financial report was filed in 2022, as well as all professional solicitors employed by the charitable organization; the fundraising methods used by the professional solicitor; the date the joint financial report was filed; the dates of the fundraising campaign covered by the joint financial report; the gross receipts from the campaign; the amount remitted to the charity; and the percentage of the gross receipts that the charity received.

Consumers can review the data from the joint financial reports in the following formats:

- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>charitable organization</u> sponsoring the fundraising campaign.
- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>professional solicitor</u> conducting the fundraising campaign.
- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>state</u> where the charitable organization is located.
- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>fundraising method</u> used.

Part II of the Professional Solicitor Report lists each professional solicitor with an active fundraising contract on file with the Division of Public Charities between the dates of October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023. The report also lists each charity client of the professional solicitor for which a contract was filed; the type of fundraising method used; the dates of the solicitation campaign; and either the minimum guaranteed percentage of gross receipts to be remitted to the charity based on the contract, or other terms of remuneration.

Consumers can review the data from the fundraising contracts in the following formats:

- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>professional solicitor</u> conducting the fundraising campaign.
- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>charitable organization</u> sponsoring the fundraising campaign.
- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>state</u> where the professional solicitor is located.
- Sorted in alphabetical order according to the <u>fundraising method</u> used.

Although each charitable organization and professional solicitor referenced in this report was registered with the Division of Public Charities to solicit donations in South Carolina at the time the fundraising campaigns were conducted, many of the joint financial reports and contracts were for national campaigns. Therefore, it is important to note that the reported gross receipts reflect donations from all solicited persons, not just South Carolinians. Furthermore, the data presented in the Professional Solicitor Report does not reflect how much the charitable organizations spent on their program services. This information is available through the Give Smart SC app or on the Secretary of State's website at sos.sc.gov, under Charities Search. You may also search professional fundraisers registered with the Secretary of State and review joint financial reports by using the Professional Fundraisers Search feature on the Secretary of State's website at sos.sc.gov.
